The International IOBG meeting will be at Put-in-Bay this year on October 10th thru 13th. Come and support the officers and staff. It will be a great time.





District Approval Signature will be by our District 7 Treasurer Appropriate Dues must be submitted with application Completed Application with payment of dues to be sent to Treasurer: IOBG-D7 c/o Kathryn McCarthy 8577 Hilltop Drive Mentor, Ohio 44060

- 3. Upon receipt of application and dues, Treasurer will notify D-7 President or D-7 Area Vice President. They will make arrangements to officially swear applicant in. <u>ONLY A D-7 OFFICER IS</u> <u>AUTHORIZED TO PERFORM SWEARING IN.</u> If this can not successfully be arranged, applicant is invited to join us at the Blue Blazer Social in March where they can be sworn in.
- 4. Dues payment will be distributed to International by Treasurer and a membership card will be generated and sent to applicant. (currently, Kathryn McCarthy is preparing cards).
